In addition, the President of the Ontario Division, or their appointee, shall be accorded delegate status. Area Councils shall be allowed one (1) voting delegate. Fraternal delegates shall be permitted voice in any debate which is of a non-constitutional nature. A coordinated bargaining committee composed of five (5) or more Local Unions shall be allowed one (1) voting delegate. At no time shall any one local have more than ten (10) voting delegates.



Workshop descriptions for OMECC

1.0 Preventing mental injuries at work

New forms of work, job insecurity, work intensification, high demands, violence and a resulting poor work-life balance are resulting in psychosocial and mental health problems in CUPE workplaces. This module focuses on the workplace as the cause of mental health issues, and not the individual. Discuss strategies and actions that help make workplaces psychologically healthier and safer.

2.0 Women and work hazards

This module looks at the impact of the physical and social work environment on women's health, and ways to influence research, policy and practice to reduce the health disparities related to gender.

3.0 Being an ally for equality

Championing human rights in the workplace and the Union is an important role for stewards. What does it really mean to be a good ally?

4.0 <u>Creating harassment-free workplaces</u>

Learn how to recognize harassment, educate the members about harassment, and represent members who are involved in harassment complaints.

5.0 Core Services Review

We will discuss the types of reviews that exist, learn how to spot early indicators and talk about campaign planning against such reviews.

6.0 How Municipalities Work

Building Fair and Sustainable Communities and how to understand Municipal finances.

7.0 Strategic Planning for bargaining

In this workshop, participants will look at effective ways to engage members before bargaining begins, and throughout the bargaining process

8.0 <u>Strike Prep</u>

To be effective, a strike needs to be well organized. This workshop covers the four pillars of a wellrun strike: administration, finance/strike pay, communications and picket schedules.

9.0 Leading as a Team

In this workshop, executive teams explore power and responsibility that comes with it, how we work in teams and how to balance our leadership styles to engage the membership and work effectively across diversity.
